

HOME BEAT Hykeham Rural has seen a decrease in reports of Burglary and Violence, and we have concentrated on joint initiatives with our colleagues in Nottinghamshire Police, with early hour plain clothed patrols, and search warrants. In both the Town & Rural areas I am promoting the use of Lincs alert, and seeking to improve the communication we have with the Neighbourhood Watches. It is only through the direction given by the community, using local intelligence, that I can direct the teams, and utilise other Police Department resources, to proactively target areas, and those criminals responsible.



What is a Neighbourhood Panel?

Your Neighbourhood Panel consists of local people, and representatives of the community, who live or work in the area. The panel's purpose is to identify issues that are affecting the community taking into account the views of the community. They meet quarterly and assess all the information collected at the meeting, and consider all the issues raised. The panel then agree on neighbourhood policing priorities to be focused on during the next three month period. The Neighbourhood Policing Team then adopt a problem solving approach and are encouraged and empowered to work locally with NKDC and government agencies to address the priorities set.
